


In *The Book of Romance*, Tommy Nelson states: “I strongly encourage every young man who is in a dating relationship to say to the young woman **after four or five dates**,

“I don’t know if you are the person God has for me to marry, but I want you to know that you are the type of woman I would enjoy spending my life with, I like being with you, and I’m open to seeing if this relationship goes somewhere. If you want to back out of our dating relationship right now, then that’s all right. You owe me nothing but honesty.”

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


