

Te Tiriti, Civics, and Citizenship Wānanga:

mā mua, mō muri

ASSEN and TRCC are excited to announce an incredible four-day learning experience for teachers with a passion for social studies education. The course will take place from 27 - 30 September 2020. There will be places available for 10 primary teachers and 10 secondary teachers. Our expectation is that attendees will be champions of this kaupapa as a result of their attendance on this course. Applications to attend are now open.

The course recognizes the significance of the intersection of Civics and Citizenship Education and Aotearoa New Zealand Histories in our curriculum.

We begin our journey in the beautiful Bay of Islands at Waitangi. In the first two days we will explore the role of this place in our nation's stories: past, present, and future. We seek to better understand what really happened at Waitangi in 1840 and how Te Tiriti has shaped Aotearoa New Zealand.

The second two days will be spent in Wellington. We will reflect on the unique evolution of civics and citizenship in Aotearoa New Zealand through visiting the outstanding exhibition *He Tohu* at the National Library and visiting parliament. These experiences, coupled with our learning about Te Tiriti while in Waitangi, encourage attendees to consider the opportunities to be involved - and involve others - in the democratic life of our communities and nation in a way that honours Te Tiriti. The course ends with a workshop that develops ways to support participants to be champions of this Kaupapa with their akonga and communities.

The course will use a wānanga format developed by Associate Professor Tom Roa (Waikato University, Tainui-Ngāti Maniapoto); Dr Hana O'Regan (General Manager Oranga, Ngāi Tahu) and Ngati Kawa Taituha (Waitangi Marae Chair, Ngā Puhī). Our circle of expertise includes Tom, Hana and Ngati Kawa as well as Dr Bronwyn Wood (Te Herenga Waka - Victoria University of Wellington) and Maria Perreau (Aotearoa Social Studies Educators' Network).

This is the first course for teachers exploring this Kaupapa in this way. Please consider joining us for what we hope will be, in many ways, a transformative experience. Important logistic course information below —please read carefully:

This course is over 4 days in the first week of the Sept/Oct school holidays (2 days in Waitangi (1 night marae accom) and 2 days in Wellington (2 nights hotel accom)). **Travel from Home to Waitangi, Waitangi to Wellington and Wellington to home is the responsibility of participants / schools to book and pay for.** All other costs associated with the course are included in the registration fee of \$887.50. TRCC are offering **\$450** reimbursement subsidy for all **20 teachers** accepted on this course. ASSEN are offering **10** primary teachers **\$700** reimbursement subsidy for attending this course. The PPTA link in this flyer explains the subsidy available to PPTA secondary teachers. Participants need to arrive at Waitangi before **10:30am Sunday 27 Sept for the Pōwhiri**. There is a plane leaving Auckland at 8:30am arriving at Kerikeri 9:30am on the 27th Sept with a connecting shuttle organised to take you to Waitangi. Alternatively, you may wish to arrive in Waitangi on Saturday, you will need to organise your own accommodation on Saturday night if you choose to do this. Accommodation at Waitangi is covered in your course fee of \$887.50 for 1 night on Te Tii Marae, and accommodation in Wellington is for 2 nights at the Thorndon Hotel.
