



Button clasp with cords

Materials needed for this project


- A piece of cord
- Large closed jump rings
- Large hole beads
- 1 x Metal Button

Step 1. Take a metre length of cord, thread through the button, making sure the button is in the centre. Then put the 2 pieces of cord together and tie an overhand bow knot as close to the button as possible.




Step 2. Onto the left side of the cord, thread on 1 x metal bead, then put 2 cords together and thread them both through the metal closed ring.

Step 3. Onto the right cord, thread 1 x metal bead, then put the cords together again and thread on another ring.




Step 4. Continue repeating steps 2 and 3 alternating from one piece of cord to the other until you reach your desired length. 35 beads will give you a bracelet of approx 21cm. Make sure you end on a bead, not a ring



Step 5. Put the pieces of cord together pull your beads and rings up towards your button to get rid of any unwanted gaps, then tie them with an overhand bow knot. Then leave approx a 2cm gap and create another overhand bow knot. This is to create a loop for the button to go through, so make sure the button fits through the gap in between both knots. For extra security, you can dab some super glue onto the knot. If you're giving the bracelet away and not sure of the size, it is good to create a further knot leaving a 2cm gap from the last one. This way there is an option to wear the bracelet bigger or smaller.

Step 6. Either, trim the ends of the cord close to the knot to finish or for each cord end, thread on a metal bead and tie with an overhand knot, then trim the excess cord.



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
